

In October of 1885, Bethel was organized by a group of parishioners meeting in the home of the late Mr. and Mrs. Junius Wilkerson. The purpose of organizing the church was to meet the religious needs of the growing White Plains community and the advancement of the kingdom of God. The church was incorporated on April 23, 1890 and the property at 1 Fisher Court was purchased for one dollar. A single frame building was erected on the site and dedicated on May 17, 1891.

Look where God has brought us from. Over the years, the church through the congregation has touched many lives and has been involved in many programs and worthwhile causes. The congregation has overcome many challenges and obstacles

through their faith and unity. #### THE SENATE CONFIRMS KETANJI BROWN JACKSON TO SERVE ON THE U.S. SUPREME COURT



Since Justice Stephen Breyer announced his retirement, President Biden has conducted a rigorous process to identify his replacement. President Biden sought a candidate with exceptional credentials, unimpeachable character, and unwavering dedication to the rule of law. And the President sought an individual who is

committed to equal justice under the law and who understands the profound impact that the Supreme Court's decisions have on the lives of the American people.

That is why the President nominated Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson to serve as the next Justice on the Supreme Court. Judge Jackson is one of our nation's brightest legal minds and has an unusual breadth of experience in our legal system, giving her the perspective to be an exceptional Justice.

#### About Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson



Judge Jackson was born in Washington, DC and grew up in Miami, Florida. Her parents attended segregated primary schools, then attended historically black colleges and universities. Both started their careers as public school teachers and became leaders and administrators in the Miami-Dade Public School System. When Judge Jackson was in preschool, her father attended law school. In a 2017 lecture, Judge Jackson traced her love of the law back to sitting next to her father in their apartment as he tackled his law school

homework—reading cases and preparing for Socratic questioning—while she undertook her preschool homework—coloring books.

Judge Jackson stood out as a high achiever throughout her childhood. She was a speech and debate star who was elected "mayor" of Palmetto Junior High and student body president of Miami Palmetto Senior High School. But like many Black women, Judge Jackson still faced naysayers. When Judge Jackson told her high school guidance counselor she wanted to attend Harvard, the guidance counselor warned that Judge Jackson should not set her "sights so high."

That did not stop Judge Jackson. She graduated *magna cum laude* from Harvard University, then attended Harvard Law School, where she graduated cum laude and was an editor of the *Harvard Law Review*.

#### Men's Ministry Panel Discussion & Men's Day

Our Men's Day is held annually on the 3rd Sunday of March, but it has been 2 years since we were able to celebrate together in the sanctuary. We thank God for keeping the Men's Ministry of Bethel together. The Men's Day theme was, "Becoming an Emotionally Healthy Man." The theme Scripture was James 1:2-4 "Consider it pure joy my brothers and sisters whenever you face threats of any kind......" Our Men's Day was a 2 day event: On Friday March 18, there was a panel discussion on Zoom for men, followed by a worship service. Our panel was made up of some of the younger male role models from our congregation Bro Andre Early, Bro Michael Rhodes, and Bro Matthew Smith, and Rev Shaun Jones was the facilitator. Our panel discussion was a very lively and informative discussion on some of the trials that men of faith are going through today. I was personally blown away by the candid questions and responses by our young panelists. I applaud our Pastor for his vision to change it up and let us hear from these young men how the Lord is pouring into their lives.

The worship service was brought to by Rev A'Kim Beecham of the Maranatha Baptist Church of Queens Village NY., who was introduced by Deacon Henry Mills. The welcome was done by Bro Jemal Mosley, reading of scripture Bro Michael Coaxum, and prayer by Deacon Dewitt Smith. Our worship music was by the Men of Bethel Praise team (Deacon Jackson, Bro Hudson, and Bro Earl) led by our director of music Deacon Donald Stevens, and our sermonic selection was by Professor Glen Gibson. Rev. Beecham brought us a powerful word from the book of James using our theme: **Becoming an Emotionally Healthy Man**. He said all of us are in the process of becoming --the problem is that we are too busy trying to overcome.



We should be more focused on what we are becoming. If we have patience that will produce perfection. He used the analogy of a farmer and his understanding of patience—a farmer plows, plants and patiently waits for his season of harvest. **Patience produces perfection.** Thank you, Rev Beecham for that powerful word.

Our Sunday worship service was a hybrid (in-person and live streamed) service. Our call to worship was from Psalms 133. Scripture was read by Bro David Coleman James1: 2-4 and prayer by Bro Tom Boyer, and the music by the Men of Bethel Praise Team under the direction of Deacon Stevens. The introduction of our speaker Bro James Bason was by Trustee Herbert Strobert. Although Bro Bason declared that he is not a preacher, he brought us words of encouragement to make us think and live by. He gave us a personal testimony with instructions to "guard your heart - do not follow your heart" Say

like David "create in me a clean heart o' God--create a right spirit in me" Bro Bason definitely gave us words to meditate on.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccines for Young Children** @

CDC Director Rochelle P. Walensky, M.D., M.P.H., endorsed the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP) recommendation that all children 6 months through 5 years of age should receive a COVID-19 vaccine. This expands eligibility for vaccination to nearly 20 million additional children and means that all Americans ages 6 months and older are now eligible for vaccination.

Parents and caregivers can now get their children 6 months through 5 years of age vaccinated with the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna vaccines to better protect them from COVID-19. All children, including children who have already had COVID-19, should get vaccinated.
