

Mr. Charles E. Mebane, Sr. is a life-long resident of White Plains, NY. The longest contribution Charles Mebane has made in the White Plains community is tied to his vocation – a barber. He was employed by Mr. Mitchell for a shop on Dr. Martin Luther King Boulevard, formerly known as Grove St. The shop relocated to Central Ave., and his patrons were happy to continue with their kind-hearted barber. After Mr. Mitchell retired, Charles joined the shop of Mr. Ollie Ashe on Fisher Avenue. It is very possible that Mr. Mebane has cut the hair of not less than twenty-five percent of the black hair cutting community in White Plains. Two to three generations of family's sons, nephews and grandsons have benefited from his craftsmanship. In fact, Mr. Mebane has cut the hair of Roy Campanella (professional baseball leaguer), and Gordon Parks (professional photographer). Nonetheless, he treated those who sat in his chair of business as individuals of honor. Charles Mebane was more than a barber; he was mentor, advisor, teacher and at times even a therapist. While in other barber shops you would mostly hear about last night's game or who got in trouble across town, when you sat in Mr. Mebane's chair, young men received long talks about life, manhood, the do's and don'ts of life...sound advice. Mr. Mebane remains a gentleman and mentor in voice and action helping generations of young men stay on track. Charles Mebane is a cherished member of the White Plains community. Seventy years is a lot of haircuts, trims, after shave cream on chins and Old Spice!

## Gilda Strudwick, Senior Inspector, Department of Consumer Protection



Gilda Strudwick has been a leader in our County in protecting the rights of consumers for over 35 years. Gilda plays a key role in expanding the Consumer Protection Department's community outreach at public events. She assists the Director at speaking engagements, and coordinates staffing for County events such as Salute to Seniors and various cultural festivals. She displays excellent communication skills in speaking with hundreds of consumers, understanding their concerns and finding ways to assist them. Gilda joined the Department of Consumer Protection as an inspector trainee in 1987, was promoted to inspector after one year,

and became the Department's first female inspector. Gilda has been responsible for enforcing both State and County consumer protection laws relating to retail pricing, point of sale system accuracy and other rights of consumers, including refunds and returns in retail transactions. She supervises the Youth Crime Protection Act which regulates the sale of spray paint, box cutters and laser pointers. In 2008, Gilda was promoted to Senior Inspector and assumed additional responsibilities within the Department, including the licensing of contractors, and conducting hearings to review consumer complaints. Gilda is also responsible for the Department's consumer publications, and mentoring new employees.



## COVID-19 Vaccines for Young Children 🖉

CDC Director Rochelle P. Walensky, M.D., M.P.H., endorsed the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices' (ACIP) recommendation that all children 6 months through 5 years of age should receive a COVID-19 vaccine. This expands eligibility for vaccination to nearly 20 million additional children and means that all Americans ages 6 months and older are now eligible for vaccination.

Parents and caregivers can now get their children 6 months through 5 years of age vaccinated with the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna vaccines to better protect them from COVID-19. All children, including children who have already had COVID-19, should get vaccinated.
