Once again, we find our faith challenged and spirits crushed as another unarmed Black man has been brutally murdered by police in Memphis. Ironically this time the pain was at a deeper level for me and many others as the perpetrators in this instance were Black police officers of a special unit charged with protecting and serving, not beating and murder. We have held prayer vigils and protests across our nation decrying the violence and screaming to the top of our lungs, "Black Lives Matter"!!!

The violence perpetrated against Black men specifically and people of color in general, is having a traumatic effect upon our people and communities especially our children and youth. I attended a prayer vigil with other preachers,

community leaders, and public officials sponsored by the NAACP on Tuesday, January 31 st decrying this current insanity. In the midst of it all we still encouraged those present to hold on to their hope and keep the faith. We must speak out and stand up against violence of any form and encourage love and peace in our communities and across the nation. As the church we must continue to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. We must stand against all injustice as well as teach the principles of love and peace as taught and modeled by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. More than ever, we must share the good news of the gospel and make disciples of all nations. We must teach and practice love for one another because we are our brother's keeper.

Jeremiah 29:7 states, "And seek the peace of the city where I have caused you to be carried away captive, and pray to the Lord for it; for in its peace, you will have peace."

With every crisis or challenge there is always opportunity. Let us serve as a beacon of hope shining our light through this dark moment in time. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, "Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." As we celebrate Black History Month, let us shine a light on our humanity and greatness as a people that have persevered, achieved, and overcome in spite of many....Cont. on page 6

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing their central role in U.S. history. Also known as African American History Month, the event grew out of "Negro History Week," the brainchild of noted historian Carter G. Woodson and other prominent African Americans. Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries around the world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating Black history.

NAACP

Spurred by growing racial violence in the early 20th century, and particularly by 1908 race riots in Springfield, Illinois is, a group of African American leaders joined together to form a new permanent civil rights organization, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP).

Jack Johnson became the first African American man to hold the World Heavyweight Champion boxing title in 1908. He held onto the belt until 1915.

First Lawyer

John Mercer Langston was the first Black man to become a lawyer when he passed the bar in Ohio in 1854. When he was elected to post of Town Clerk for Brownhelm, Ohio, in 1855 Langston became one of the first African American ever elected to public office in America. of the first African American ever elected to public office in America.

While **Rosa Parks** is credited with helping to spark the Civil Rights movement when she refused to give up her public bus seat to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama in 1955inspiring the Montgomery Bus Boycott – the lesser-known Claudette Colvin was arrested nine months prior for not giving up her bus sear to whit passengers.

Supreme Court

Thurgood Marshall was the first African American ever appointed to the U.S. Supreme Court, serving from 1967 – 1991.

Madam C.J. Walker was born on a cotton plantation in Louisiana and became wealthy after inventing a line of African American hair care products. She established Madame C.J. Walker Laboratories and was also known for philanthropy.



Gillibrand will deliver an address highlighting her work in Congress to uplift communities of faith and provide information on resources available to apply for federal grants.

The Summit will also feature U.S. Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, House Democratic Leader Hakeem Jeffries, Senator Reverend Raphael Warnock, senior Biden administration officials, and other national leaders, including Reverend Al Sharpton.

The U.S. has the highest incarceration rate in the world.

Yvonne Harris, Dr. Frozine Reece-Smith and Sharon Gilham are members of this ministry and Bethel Baptist Church. The goal of this ministry is to provide two Weekends per year (Friday- Sunday) for women impacted by incarceration. These women referred to as "Guests" have an opportunity to get to know others that share similar struggles and concerns. The next Weekend is scheduled to take place May 5-7, 2023. The goal of this "Weekend" is to provide a loving safe supportive environment while addressing the Guest's spiritual needs.

It costs approximately \$15,000 to carry out a Weekend. Guests do not pay a fee. All expenses are covered by donations. 


