Theme for February: Fellowship & Community

Scripture Acts 2:41-42

Then those who gladly received his word were baptized; and that day about three thousand souls were added to them. 42 And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers.

Say his name... "TYRE NICHOLS!!!"



Once again, we find our faith challenged and spirits crushed as another unarmed Black man has been brutally murdered by police in Memphis. Ironically this time the pain was at a deeper level for me and many others as the perpetrators in this instance were Black police officers of a special unit charged with protecting and serving, not beating and murder. We have held prayer vigils and protests across our nation decrying the violence and screaming to the top of our lungs, "Black Lives Matter"!!!

The violence perpetrated against Black men specifically and people of color in general, is having a traumatic effect upon our people and communities especially our children and youth. I attended a prayer vigil with other preachers, community leaders, and public officials sponsored by the NAACP on Tuesday, January 31 st decrying this current insanity. In the midst of it all we still encouraged those present to hold on to their hope and keep the faith. We must speak out and stand up against violence of any form and encourage love and peace in our communities and across the nation. As the church we must continue to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. We must stand against all injustice as well as teach the principles of love and peace as taught and modeled by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. More than ever, we must share the good news of the gospel and make disciples of all nations. We must teach and practice love for one another because we are our brother's keeper.

Jeremiah 29:7 states, "And seek the peace of the city where I have caused you to be carried away captive, and pray to the Lord for it; for in its peace, you will have peace."

With every crisis or challenge there is always opportunity. Let us serve as a beacon of hope shining our light through this dark moment in time. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. said, "Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." As we celebrate Black History Month, let us shine a light on our humanity and greatness as a people that have persevered, achieved, and overcome in spite of many....Cont. on page 6

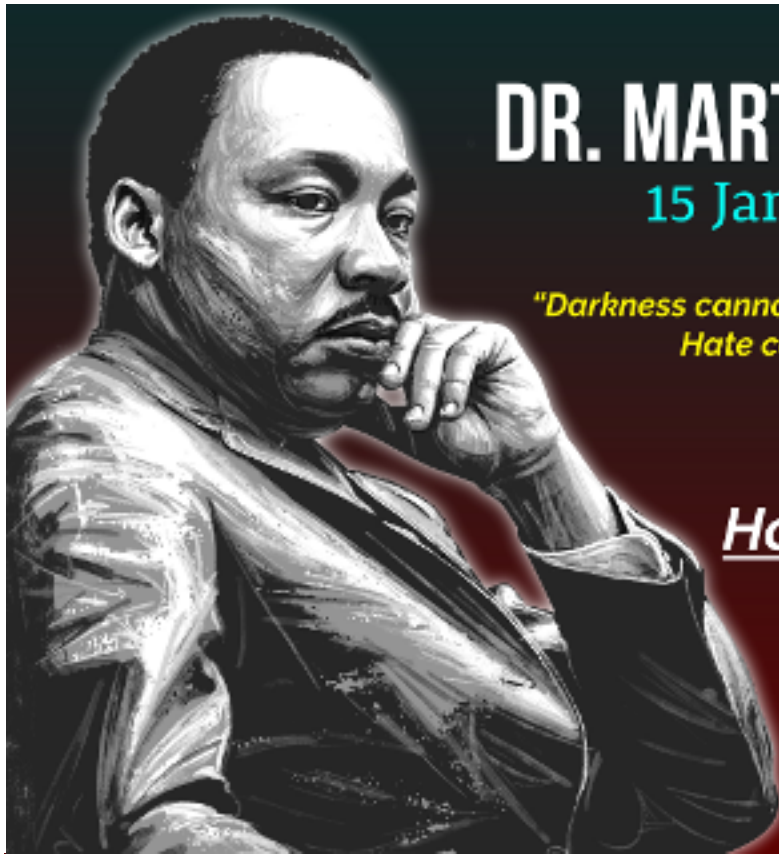

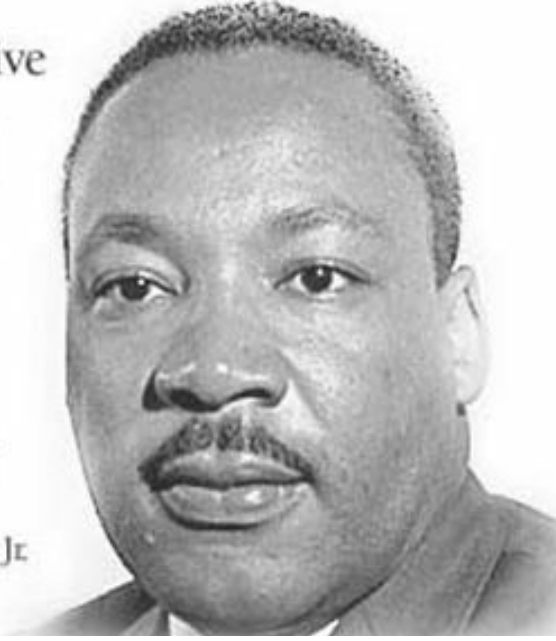

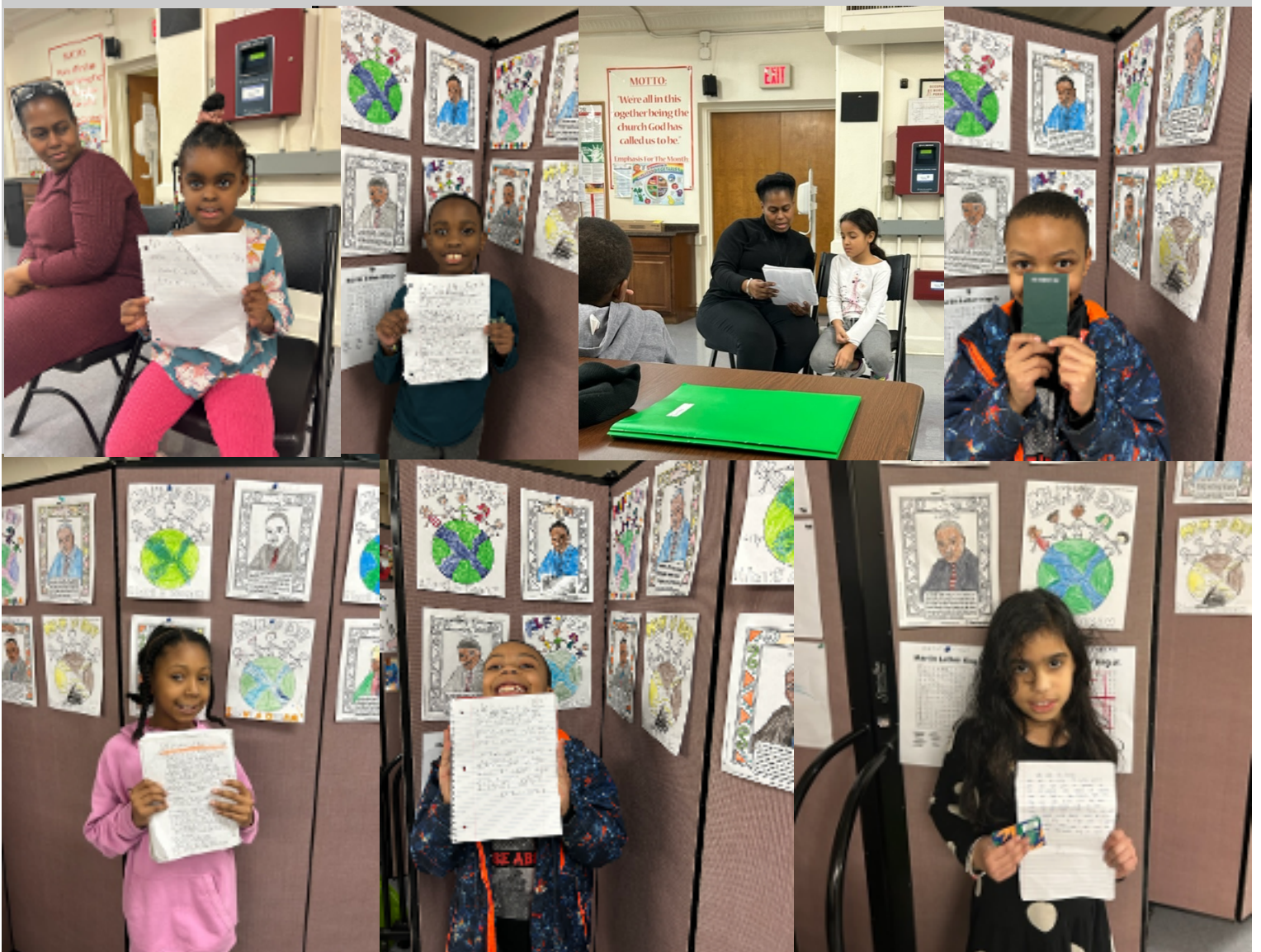

BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing their central role in U.S. history. Also known as African American History Month, the event grew out of "Negro History Week," the brainchild of noted historian Carter G. Woodson and other prominent African Americans. Since 1976, every U.S. president has officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries around the world, including Canada and the United Kingdom, also devote a month to celebrating Black history.

NAACP



Spurred by growing racial violence in the early 20th century, and particularly by 1908 race riots in Springfield, Illinois, a group of African American leaders joined together to form a new permanent civil rights organization, the **National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP)**.

Heavyweight Champ

Jack Johnson became the first African American man to hold the World Heavyweight Champion boxing title in 1908. He held onto the belt until 1915.



First Lawyer



John Mercer Langston was the first Black man to become a lawyer when he passed the bar in Ohio in 1854. When he was elected to post of Town Clerk for Brownhelm, Ohio, in 1855 Langston became one of the first African American ever elected to public office in America. of the first African American ever elected to public office in America.

While **Rosa Parks** is credited with helping to spark the Civil Rights movement when she refused to give up her public bus seat to a white man in Montgomery, Alabama in 1955- inspiring the Montgomery Bus Boycott - the lesser-known **Claudette Colvin** was arrested nine months prior for not giving up her bus seat to white passengers.

Supreme Court



Thurgood Marshall was the first African American ever appointed to the U.S. Supreme Court, serving from 1967 - 1991.

Madam C.J. Walker was born on a cotton plantation in Louisiana and became wealthy after inventing a line of African American hair care products. She established Madame C.J. Walker Laboratories and was also known for philanthropy.

Robert Johnson became the first African American billionaire when he sold the cable station he founded, Black Entertainment Television (BET) in 2001.

In 2008, **Barack Obama** became the first Black president of the United States.

George Washington Carver developed 300 derivative products from peanuts among them cheese, milk, coffee, flour, ink, dyes, plastics, wood stains, soap, linoleum, medicinal oils and cosmetics.

Eminent Scientist



First Woman Representative



Shirley Chisholm was the first African American woman elected to the House of Representatives. She was elected in 1968 and represented the state of New York. She broke ground again four years later in 1972 when she was the first major party African American candidate for president of the United States.

Hiram Rhodes Revels was the first African American ever elected to the U. S. Senate. He represented the state of Mississippi from February to 1870 to March 1871.

WASHINGTON, D.C. – This week, on Thursday, January 26th, U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand will host her African American Faith Leaders Summit in Washington, D.C.

The summit will bring over 130 African American faith leaders from across New York State to Washington to discuss some of the most pressing issues facing our communities, including health equity, gun violence, and public safety. Gillibrand will deliver an address highlighting her work in Congress to uplift communities of faith and provide information on resources available to apply for federal grants.

The Summit will also feature U.S. Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer, House Democratic Leader Hakeem Jeffries, Senator Reverend Raphael Warnock, senior Biden administration officials, and other national leaders, including Reverend Al Sharpton.

Kairos Outside N.Y.C. is the local chapter of Kairos Prison Ministry International. This Ministry is designed for women impacted by incarceration. Someone in their life is or was in prison. In many ways the families are “doing time” right along with the incarcerated. This Ministry is also designed for women that were previously incarcerated. The U.S. has the highest incarceration rate in the world.

Yvonne Harris, Dr. Frozine Reece-Smith and Sharon Gilham are members of this ministry and Bethel Baptist Church. The goal of this ministry is to provide two Weekends per year (Friday- Sunday) for women impacted by incarceration. These women referred to as “Guests” have an opportunity to get to know others that share similar struggles and concerns. The next Weekend is scheduled to take place May 5-7, 2023. The goal of this “Weekend” is to provide a loving safe supportive environment while addressing the Guest’s spiritual needs.

It costs approximately \$15,000 to carry out a Weekend. Guests do not pay a fee. All expenses are covered by donations. Our Sunday School lessons will sometimes challenge us to not only study God's word but, rightfully so, to put the word into action. We decided to think and pray for a way to give back to children.

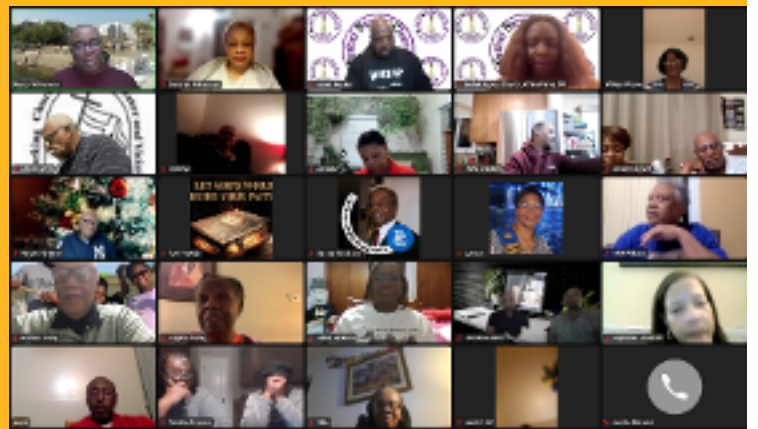
It was decided that our efforts would go into helping a young lady who started a middle school on faith and very little money.

Observing Lent



Lent is a period of fasting, repentance, and spiritual discipline in the Christian faith, traditionally observed during the 40 days leading up to Easter. In 2023, it starts on Wednesday, February 23, and ends on Maundy Thursday, which is on April 6th. This 40-day period is traditionally a time for believers to focus on their relationship with God and to consider their own sin and mortality.

After all the excitement and celebration of Advent, as well as its public observance in church services around the globe, the season of Lent gives individuals the time and space to quiet their minds and hearts and look inward. This is a season of quiet introspection, as winter wanes and the growing light of longer days points Christ-followers toward the true Light that came into the world to give us all life.

Lent gives Christians around the world time and space to reflect on what the birth of Jesus points toward: the life, ministry, passion, and death of Jesus. The celebration of Easter that immediately follows Lent is typically bright, joyous, and happy, but while we wait to celebrate that world-changing day with Christians around the world, Lent gives Christians a time to look inward, to pause and consider what Jesus' saving work means for each one of us.

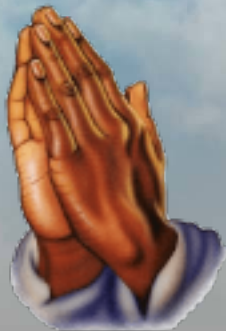

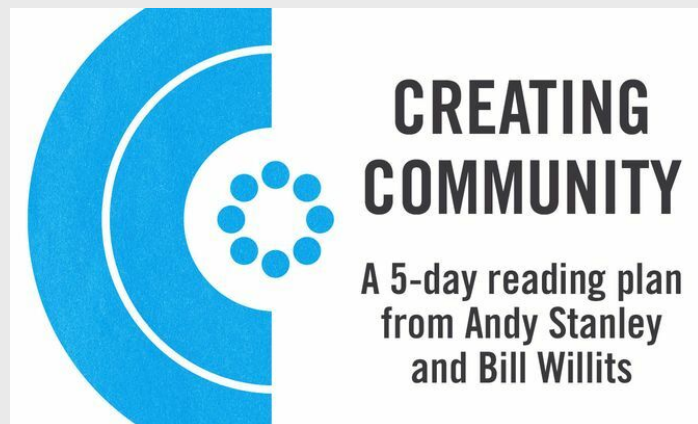
