Introduction

Daniel

- Sixth-century B. C. prophet
- Jewish Babylonian captive
- Noble, possibly of royal lineage

Background

- Book opens after King Nebuchadnezzar's first siege of Judah in 605 B.C.
- Daniel and friends brought to Babylon
- Daniel's ministry ends sometime after the third year of the reign of Cyrus the Great, the Medo-Persian King
- Purpose: To encourage hope during the times of the Gentiles. Hope is promoting by emphasizing God's rule is greater than the kingdom of men.
- Structure: Daniel is a narrative that includes history, prophecy, and apocalyptic visions.
